Science World has been on the road! The *On The Road* program brings fun, high-energy live demonstrations and activities to communities all around the province that pique science curiosity, boost science literacy and inspire future science and technology leaders. Canalta Elementary students are learning coding using *Scratch* - the world's largest coding community for children that uses a simple coding language that allows students to create digital stories, games and animations.

Grade 7 students at Little Prairie Elementary are learning about careers. The students went to the local Northern Lights College Campus to check out the Youth Explore Trades (YETS) program. The YETS program introduces students in grades 10-12 to five trades including, but not limited to, Carpentry, Mechanics, Plumbing, Electrical, Professional Cook, and Welding. The program is a way for students to explore multiple trades and pick up valuable skills in the process. The program is a partnership between the Ministry of Education and SkilledTradesBC, designed to give students 120 hours of hands-on experience.





Basketball season is in full swing at most schools and community firefighters and paramedics joined in on the fun – a 17-year tradition at Crescent Park Elementary School! The grade 8 boys basketball team at DCSS Central Campus wanted it on record they beat the firefighters and paramedics by 1 point!
