PRIDE MONTH

To celebrate and recognize the pride community and so that the marginalized People of Colour could be recognized as part of the community, Crescent Park will once more be flying the progressive pride flag. The rainbow colours in the initial pride flag each represent different aspects:

Red – love and life

Orange – healing

Yellow – sunlight

Green - nature

Indigo – serenity

Violet – spirituality.

The addition of the chevron stripes came later:

Black – diversity

Brown – inclusivity

The light blue, pink and white stripes were added to represent transgender and non-binary individuals.

Finally, the yellow triangle with the purple circle inside represents those who are born intersex.


