Jump Rope for Heart - February 28th

Last year, our school was recognized as a top Canadian school earner and participant in The Heart and Stroke Foundation's Jump Rope for Heart Program. Last year, we raised over \$8,000 due to your commitment and generosity. The teachers last year offered various challenges to assist with the fundraising. One teacher cut her hair, and another dyed his. As well, a teacher was duct-taped to the wall by students.

We will roll out a series of challenges at each of the \$1,000 increments. There will be messy challenges where teachers will receive pies in the face, cold water dunks, and sprayed with whipping cream. There will be food challenges where teachers will eat spicy foods (hot peppers and hot wings) and surprise foods blindfolded (Survivor-type challenges with pickles, ice cream and ketchup), and finally dried edible insects. A finale will be extreme hair with gelled spikes, temporary hair colour and braided styles for teachers.
